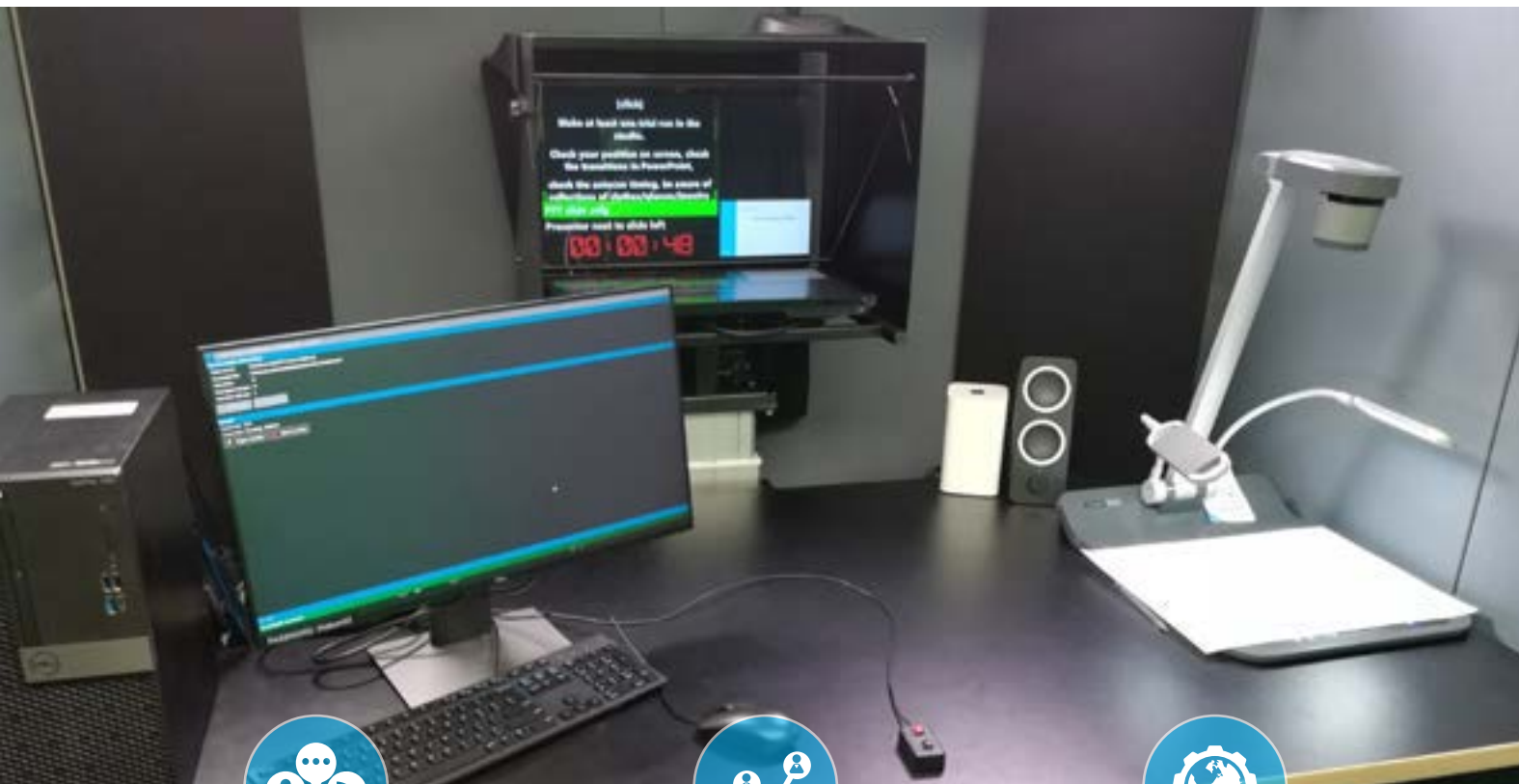


QUICK START

USING THE RECORD AND GO DIY IN THE TEACHING LAB



Only a PowerPoint presentation needed

In the Do-it-yourself studio at the Teaching lab you only need a PowerPoint presentation to record. The autocue text needs to be embedded in your PowerPoint. You bring your PowerPoint on a USB drive and can load it on the computer at the studio. The second camera (DocCam) allows you to draw or show printed documents during your recording.

Choose your position on screen

The PowerPoint is leading in this studio, with 8 different lay-outs you decide your position for the video. The software gives you the freedom to adjust this per slide. Will you be in front of your slides or not visible at all? Do you have no content to show? You can use a background image to bring a more informal setting to your video.

One click recording

The closed system gives you the ease of use to record with one click. After the set-up you only use the clicker to go to your next slide. You can just focus on your recording and play it back afterwards to evaluate your performance. The video will be automatically saved after recording.

SET-UP THE DIY

Load your PowerPoint presentation

Once you started the computer in the studio you can open the "Autonomous WebClip2Go Controller" software to start your session. After the bottom bar turns green, you can start the set-up and load your PowerPoint from your USB drive.



02

Decide on your format

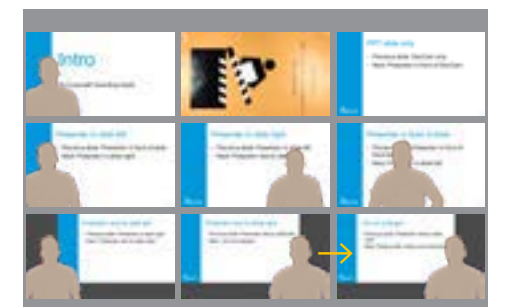
In the set-up screen you can choose to record with, or without the TU Delft branded animations at start and finish. This influences the timing of your autocue at the start, so test this with your own PowerPoint.



03

Set the lay-outs

You have different lay-out possibilities. Per slide you can decide where you need to be positioned in your video. The first slide is always set. To use the DocCam, you will need an empty slide so you can set the DocCam lay-out there.



04

Record your video

When everything is set, you can start recording with the black button on the clicker. Be careful, don't use the red button. The video is only saved when you reach the end of your presentation by using the black button on the clicker.
